Scripture Readings

Genesis 32:24-31

Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, 'Let me go, for the day is breaking.' But Jacob said, 'I will not let you go, unless you bless me.' So he said to him, 'What is your name?' And he said, 'Jacob.' Then the man said, 'You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed.' Then Jacob asked him, 'Please tell me your name.' But he said, 'Why is it that you ask my name?' And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, 'For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved.' The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

Ephesians 4: 21-24

... you have heard about (Christ Jesus) and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus. You were taught to put away your former way of life, your old self ... and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to clothe yourselves with the new self, created according to the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

Music Notes

Today's music all has a connection to the communion service. The Kyrie Eleison, is a very old part of the communion service which is often still done in many churches in the original Greek: Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison, Kyrie eleison (Lord have mercy upon us, Christ have mercy upon us, Lord have mercy upon us). Two early French composers, Couperin (1668-1733) and Corrette (d. 1720) both included a work entitled "Kyrie" in a set of pieces for organ. Another Baroque French composer, Nicolas de Grigny, included a piece based on "Veni Creator Spiritus" in his First Organ Book of 1699.

British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams used a text from Psalm 34 v.8 for his beautiful communion anthem "O Taste and See". Mozart's "Ave Verum Corpus" is based on a Communion hymn from the 14th century. Another famous composer, César Franck (1822-1890), composed a popular setting of the Latin Hymn "Panis angelicus fit panis hominum" (Bread of the angels is made bread for mankind) which was originally written by St. Thomas Aquinas.
