

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Psalm 107

Give thanks to the Lord who is good, and whose mercy endures for ever.

NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

I had the great privilege of hearing Jean Langlais perform at a concert in 1970. He performed on a brand new pipe organ and like all touring organists, he had to quickly adjust to a different instrument every time he played a concert. The remarkable thing was that Langlais had lost his sight at the age of two due to glaucoma, and yet he floated around this large instrument like he had been playing it for years. The complete concert was of course from memory. Langlais had been fortunate to have studied with some of the finest teachers in France and had ended up as an instructor at a school for the blind. He also for many years had the prestigious post at the Basilica of Sainte-Clotilde in Paris where the great Cesar Franck had been. His music is modern but far more tonal than many of his contemporaries (much of whose music I find boring and I really do not enjoy). I find his music interesting, adventurous and fun to play and listen to.

The anthem is by American composer, arranger and educator Stan Pethel who has had published over 1300 works. Born in 1950, he has spent his career in Georgia, and retired in 2016 as Chair of Fine Arts at Berry College.

Today, we celebrate people from all walks of life who are using their gifts to participate in God's mission through their gifts to Presbyterians Sharing. As our church's mission and ministry fund, Presbyterians Sharing is one of the ways that Presbyterians across Canada work together to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ, sharing God's love and hope in our communities, in Canada and around the world. Because of our gifts:

- new congregations are planted and others experience growth and renewal;
- ministries with Indigenous people in Canada are serving people scarred by Residential Schools, racism, discrimination and the loss of culture and language;
