Notes from the Director of Music

When Margaret and I traveled the country roads of Prince Edward Island last month, we were struck by the number of small country churches throughout the island. The churches were all kept in beautiful shape on the outside but I wondered how

things were inside and in particular what kind of organ would they have and what kind of music was played. It made me think of a book I have entitled "The Village Organist" which was compiled by John Stainer and is a collection of music by different composers for use in a small church. I have selected 3 pieces by English composers from this delightful book for today's service. The **Prelude** is by the remarkable Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) who though born in London, was of African descent and stunned the musical world with his beautiful *Hiawatha's Wedding Feast* for chorus and orchestra published in 1898. Today he is largely forgotten, but he had studied with C.V. Stanford and had been one of the most respected composers of his day.

The **Offertory** is by Oliver Oldham Brooksband (1859 – c.1894) who was himself a village organist at different churches in England. The **Postlude** is by John Ebenezer West (1863-1929) who was a prolific composer, concert organist and editor for Novello & Co. He was also a respected choral conductor and died while conducting the Railway Clearing House Male-Voice Choir.

Another prolific composer is the contemporary American violinist Dana Mengel who wrote the setting for today's **Anthem**. From a musical family, he has over 400 pieces of music in print by various publishers. The words are by Philip Doddridge (1702-1751) who also wrote the words for three hymns in our book. It has been noted that the popularity of his writing is not because of anything special, clever or profound but because his faith and trust shine through above everything else.
