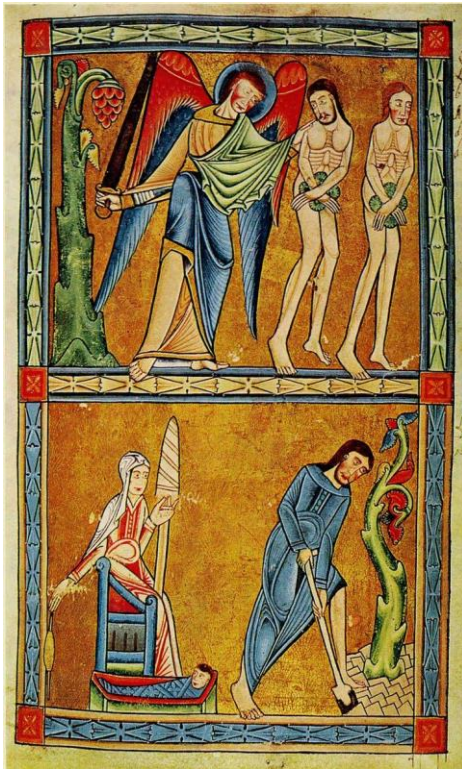


WELCOME TO ST. ANDREW'S PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
