Notes from the Organ Scholar

This week our Music Director, John Hall, is on a well-deserved vacation to Leipzig, Germany, where he will be enjoying the annual Bach Festival. The choral music for this morning's service was composed especially for Trinity Sunday by Willan and Tchaikovsky, but I think it's only fair that we get to enjoy some of Bach's music as well; and so this morning's organ selections are all from the greatest of composers, with the liturgical theme of Trinity Sunday.

John Tuttle, my first organ teacher, used to say that if you could play Bach, you could play just about anything. After learning today's **Prelude**, I started to see what he was talking about. Bach wrote six Trio Sonatas which are widely considered the most difficult pieces ever written for organ. They require the lone organist to take on the role of all three instruments in a musical trio, playing three equally important and interdependent lines of music—which I think is a perfect metaphor for the Holy Trinity.

The **Offertory** is from Bach's 'Little organ book' which he composed as a teaching tool for his students. It introduces trio texture with a chorale which talks about our reliance on God and our search to find an understanding of God's voice. Only at the end do we get a real resolution: the three lines come together in unison when the text speaks of the voice of God.

A number of weeks ago, I played the Great Prelude in a minor; this week, the **Postlude** is its companion, the fugue. The theme is founded on some of the most basic musical language: the triad. Yet, from something so simple, Bach is able to create one of his most virtuosic compositions for organ and sustain the listener's interest through many harmonic twists and turns before ending in a grand flourish.
