Jonah: Anger and Grace

Sunday September 2, 10:30 a.m.

Jonah does not believe the people of Nineveh deserve the grace of God, and he is angry. God uses an ivy bush to bring Jonah to his senses (4:1-9). (Note that the monthly celebration of the Lord's Supper will be September 9.)



Themes include:


Gratitude takes nothing for granted


