Tour of St. Andrew's

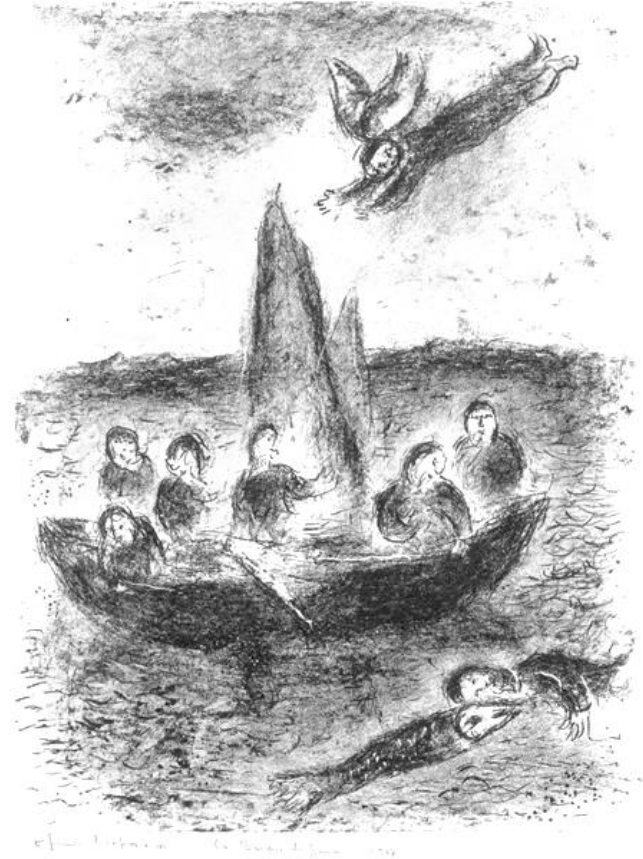
