Sunday August 18, 10:30 a.m. And Peter said 'I have no silver or gold, but what I have I give you' (Acts 3:1-16) A window dedicated in memory of one of the first Elders of St. Andrew's, John Mowat, father of Oliver Mowat, one of founders of Confederation.

Sunday August 25, 10:30 a.m. Jesus said 'The seed is the Word of God' (Luke 8: 4-15), and this window portrays Jesus himself as the sower. Can you find it in the sanctuary?
