# Scripture Reading: Mark 2:1-12

When he returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralysed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven.' Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, 'Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?' At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves; and he said to them, 'Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, "Your sins are forgiven", or to say, "Stand up and take your mat and walk"? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins'—he said to the paralytic—'I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home.' And he stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, 'We have never seen anything like this!'

# NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

John Marriott was a very modest man. Born in 1780, he studied at Christ Church, Oxford and took holy orders in 1804. He became a close friend of Sir Walter Scott and loved to write hymns. Although possessing great charm, he remained very modest and did not wish the attention received by his friend Sir Walter. He would not allow any of his hymns to be published while he was still alive. Two months after his death in 1825, his hymn Thou whose almighty word was read at a meeting of the London Missionary Society and it became instantly popular, remaining so today. The composer of the tune Moscow was Felice de Giardini who was born in Italy in 1716. He was quite unlike Marriott – quarrelsome and a bit of a loudmouth. He tried to make a career as a musician and promoter of Italian opera, but failed

miserably. He then moved to Moscow but was no more successful there. He died there in 1796, disillusioned and penniless. He is remembered mainly for this one hymn tune which we hear for the **Introit**. The first verse is sung with the original three-part version and the next verse, relevant to today's theme of healing, is the arrangement in use today.

Malcolm Archer has been organist at St. Paul's, Wells and Norwich cathedrals. For our **Anthem** today, he has combined a traditional Scottish tune with words from the Iona Community. Both words and music are a treasure.

Healey Willan is often referred to as the "Dean of Canadian Composers". He was born in England in 1880 but most of his career was in Canada. In 1967, a year before his death, he was made a Companion of the Order of Canada. His compositions, relying on very traditional forms of writing, have enriched the services of many denominations. Willan composed many choral works and several major organ works. Today's **Offertory** is based on Giardini's tune *Moscow*. In addition, we hear two more of his compositions for the **Prelude** and **Postlude**. I was unable to find organ music dealing with "healing", but the name "Healey" came to mind. So there we are.
