## **Scripture Reading** Mark 2:13-22

Jesus went out again beside the lake; the whole crowd gathered around him, and he taught them. As he was walking along, he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, 'Follow me.' And he got up and followed him.

And as he sat at dinner in Levi's house, many tax-collectors and sinners were also sitting with Jesus and his disciples—for there were many who followed him. When the scribes of the Pharisees saw that he was eating with sinners and tax-collectors, they said to his disciples, 'Why does he eat with tax-collectors and sinners?' When Jesus heard this, he said to them, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.'

Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting; and people came and said to him, 'Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?' Jesus said to them, 'The wedding-guests cannot fast while the bridegroom is with them, can they? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast on that day.'

## NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

I have to admit that it is not often I can readily appreciate a new hymn, but when I was looking for a Communion hymn appropriate for today, I came across a contemporary hymn that I thought would do nicely for our **Introit**. The text is by Carl P. Daw Jr., born in 1944, and the music by Alfred V. Feduk who was born in 1953.

All of the rest of the music is thanks to the musical skills of S. Drummond Wolff. Stanley Drummond Wolff was born in 1916 in London and graduated from the Royal College of Music in 1937. He then went on to be music director for the Gilbert and Sullivan Society in London and organist and choir director at St. Martin-in-the-Fields. During the war years he happened to get a job as conductor of the Canadian Military Headquarters Choir for their performances in Europe. This connection led to his appointment to the organ and music theory faculty at The Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto in 1946 where he taught alongside Ernest MacMillan and Healey Willan. Among his notable pupils was F.R.C. Clarke, former head of the Queen's music Department. While in Toronto, he was organist and choir director at Metropolitan United Church and began to make a name for himself as a composer of church anthems. In the mid 50's he directed choirs in Montreal before returning to England. After only a

year there, he returned to this side of the Atlantic; first to Bermuda and then ending up in California where he died in 2004.

Church musicians are thankful that he teamed up with Concordia Publishing House where he edited and arranged several collections of hymns and organ music. These editions are carefully compiled with great clarity, making them easy to read – a boon for those of us with failing eyesight.

The **Anthem** is based on a hymn which can be followed in our Book of Praise #775. The **Preludes, Offertory** and **Postlude** are all from different collections which were edited and arranged by Wolff. They all happen to feature trumpet sounds and we are blessed with six different trumpet stops on the St. Andrew's organ. The two **Preludes** are by composers featured in the upcoming concert by the St. Andrew's Baroque on October 19.
