

'With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt-offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with tens of thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?' He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

#### Mark 4:26-32

He also said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on

earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.'

#### NOTES FROM DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

Last Monday on an unusually snowy day, we celebrated Remembrance Day. When I was a young lad, my mother and grandfather would watch the ceremony from Ottawa on the old black and white Philco TV and I have made a point of continuing this tradition to this day. I can remember when suddenly one year there were no more WWI veterans in attendance and it will not be long before WWII veterans will be too old or infirm to attend. The veterans have been a ready reminder of the tragedies of war- tragedies which we must try to never repeat.

One patriotic hymn that appears in very few hymn books is today's **Introit** with words written by Sir Cecil Spring-Rice in 1918. The hymn is about our struggle for peace on earth, which we will eventually find in God's Kingdom. The music was composed by Gustav Holst (1874-1934). He spent most of his career as a teacher at a school in England. His most famous composition, *The Planets*, included a stately tune in the middle of the *Jupiter* movement. This tune he called *Thaxted*, after the village in which he had lived, and in 1921 used it for the hymn text *I Vow to Thee my Country* by Spring-Rice. The tune has since been used for many other texts including one which is found in our Book of Praise (#448).

For many years I thought that *The Planets* and *In the Bleak Midwinter* were by a German composer. In time I was informed that Gustav Holst was English. I just recently found out that his paternal great-grandfather was in fact Swedish. So sometimes it is difficult to guess the nationality of a composer. The organ music today is all by English composers with names that seem to indicate other nationalities. The **first Prelude** and the **Postlude** make use of the trumpet stops and the **second Prelude** makes use of the flute stops. The **Offertory** has an Italian sounding title but the composer was in fact born in Berlin in 1667, the son of a Lutheran minister. He moved to England and became a teacher to several prominent composers. The service ends with a piece by perhaps the greatest of all English composers, Henry Purcell (pronounced like *Pursle*).

The **Anthem** was composed in celebration of the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Sugar Creek Presbyterian Church, Kettering, Ohio. Part of the text, also by Roger Summers, is printed below:

Out of Egypt God called a people, led them through trials to God's promised land. God gave to them strength for the journey, Asked of them love in return.
And today God calls us his people, Asks of us holiness, gives us his strength. Trials may come but God will stand by us, Faithful and true, in love.
We're a people of God, called to be faithful, Called by a God who faithfully leads.
Reaching 'cross bound'ries and lifting up hearts, Faithful, trusting in God.

is World Toilet Day. In Mulanje, Malawi, about 4,000 toilets were damaged by rising water levels produced by Cyclone Idai, which swept through southeastern Africa in March. In the wake of the storm, families—especially

children under five—faced an increased risk of contracting cholera and typhoid. PWS&D responded by helping local partners rebuild latrines. Now with safe and working toilets available, 2,600 families in the hardest hit areas are looking towards a healthier future. This year, through offerings designated "Mission," members of St. Andrew's Kingston have a goal of contributing \$3,700 to the work of Christ through PWS&D.

The flowers have been placed in thanksgiving for the life of Mieke Campbell, active in the community and this congregation, assisting for over 25 years with the children in the Sunday School and with church meals.
