NOTES FROM DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

From our *Book of Praise*, our service begins with a great hymn of praise which is based on Psalm 103. Prior to the service, the organ preludes are based on two other hymns of praise: "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation" and "Let all together praise our God". A harmonization by J.S. Bach precedes these two chorales. Johann Christian Bach (1735-1782) was his son and Johann Gottfried Walther (1684-1748) was his cousin.

Christopher will sing a hymn appropriate for today's theme of forgiveness. The words were written by Rosamond E. Herklots who was born of British parents in north India in 1905. One day in 1966, she was removing weeds from her garden and she started to think about how bitterness, hatred and resentment are like poisonous weeds growing in the Christian garden of life. She had enjoyed writing poems since an early age and composed this text which was eventually published in 1969.

The Meditation after the sermon and the Postlude were written by two Belgian composers who had a great influence on French music. Jacques Lemmens (1823-1881) is better known as the teacher of the great French organists and composers, Guilmant and Widor. Cesar Franck (1822-1890) was a gifted organist and a versatile composer.

Protocol for Worship in the Sanctuary of St. Andrew's during a Time of Pandemic

- you will be greeted by an usher outside the open door of the sanctuary to answer any questions and ensure a measured entrance into the church
- the wearing of face masks at all times in the building is mandatory

- there will be no congregational singing or choir: to ensure no sharing of materials, the lyrics to hymns and scripture passages are included in the bulletin

Increasing Nutrition in Malawi



Due to fear of contracting COVID-19, people in Malawi who are already vulnerable because of the effects of HIV and AIDS have increased concerns about accessing medication and community support. Presbyterian World Service &

Development-supported Ekwendeni Hospital AIDS Program (EHAP) has been supporting those whose lives are impacted by HIV and AIDS for decades. Acknowledging these increased concerns, EHAP continues to provide community health support through physically distanced workshops to help families learn how to cook nutritiously with limited ingredients.
