SCRIPTURE READINGS

Exodus 16:4-7a

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.' So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord. For what are we, that you complain against us?'

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' When he saw them, he said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then

Jesus asked, 'Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' Then he said to him, 'Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.'

NOTES FROM DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

Despite the challenging times in which we live, we have so much to be thankful for. One thing we organists must be grateful for is the vast amount of music composed for the organ. I am grateful to the many people who have donated organ music to my museum library. This week I discovered a book of music by Max Drischner, donated by a former choir member who now lives in Texas. Drischner was born in Silesia, Germany in 1891. His musical training was influenced by Dr. Albert Schweitzer and the famous harpsichordist Wanda Landowska. He made several trips to Norway to gather its folk tunes which were used in his music. Despite the loss of part of a finger during the war, he became a well-respected keyboard performer. He was organist and cantor in both Lutheran and Catholic churches. He had a fascinating life and died in 1971. I am thankful for his music and am pleased to play one of his pieces as a **Prelude**.

The first **Prelude** is preceded by the hymn tune harmonized by J.S. Bach. The last **Prelude** is Crüger's well-known tune *Now Thank we all our God* with harmonies by Alexander Schreiner (1901-1987). Schreiner is best remembered as the organist at the Mormon Tabernacle in Salt Lake City and he inspired many with his music. The **Postlude** is a rather fancy chorale prelude based on Crüger's tune which becomes unrecognizable in this elaborate arrangement by German virtuoso Sigrid Karg-Ellert.

We must all be grateful to these many, many church organists who over the centuries have inspired us in their musical expressions of prayer and praise.

Protocol for Worship in the Sanctuary of St. Andrew's during a Time of Pandemic

Equipping Families to Fight Food Insecurity (Harvest Sunday)



In South Sudan, years of civil conflict have left much of the population without access to the food they need to live healthy lives. Rising food prices and loss of income due to COVID-19 are only increasing this

deficit. Presbyterian World Service & Development is responding through Canadian Foodgrains Bank to provide 1,150 families with food assistance that will meet their nutritional needs. Additionally, families will receive farming inputs and fishing equipment so that, when the season is right for growing and fishing, they will have access to alternative sources of nutrition.

This year, through offerings designated "Mission," members of St. Andrew's Kingston have a goal of contributing \$3,700 to the work of Christ through PWS&D.
