Meeting the Needs of Families in Beirut



The massive explosion that struck the city of Beirut in August 2020 left many people injured and homeless. Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D) responded to the devastating effects by meeting the needs of vulnerable people in Lebanon. Families received essential supplies, such as food and hygiene items, to

sustain them as they started to rebuild. Additionally, PWS&D assisted in restoring homes and schools and provided water and sanitation kits to families, as well as school kits to children.

In 2021, through offerings designated “Mission”, members of St. Andrew’s Kingston have a goal of contributing \$4,550 to the work of Christ through PWS&D.
