Then King David sent and brought him from the house of Machir son of Ammiel, at Lo Debar. Mephibosheth son of Jonathan son of Saul came to David, and fell on his face and did obeisance. ## From Outcast to Owner in Ghana



Aruk Atampure spends each day earning an income as the proprietor of a store in a community in Ghana. When Aruk was a small child, he contracted polio and lost partial use of his legs, causing him to be stigmatized by his family and others in the community.

One day, a staff member from the Presbyterian World Service & Development-supported Garu Community-Based Rehabilitation program encouraged Aruk to enrol in the program, where he received entrepreneurial training. Reflecting on the help he received at every stage of this journey, Aruk commented, “I am so grateful.”
