NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

As we enter the new year of 2022, we all have hopes for a year better than last. The year 2021 was certainly one full of challenges. Musically, we could be sad about past events, which is perhaps why the **Preludes** today are all in a minor key. The first is a hymn composed by Wofgang Figulus around 1575. Part of the text by Paul Eber goes:

"The year is passing by

with all its solemn warning".

The second **Prelude** is a hymn by Johann Steurlein (1546-1613). Part of Catherine Winkworth's translation goes:

"We thank Thee, O our God today, That Thou hast kept us through the year, When danger and distress were near."

The third **Prelude** is by J.S. Bach, based on Steurlein's hymn. This is Bach in one of his most solemn moments.

The **Postlude**, on the other hand is a joyful celebration of the New Year. This is part of a concerto for two keyboards by François Couperin (1668-1733). Perhaps some of us brought in the New Year with noisemakers. This piece uses the different trumpet stops on the organ. With this joyful noise, I wish you all a happier New Year.

Mission Moment



In Somalia, Shiindha was worried when her three-year-old son, Abdihakim, became sick and hadn't improved after two months. The treatment he received at a nearby clinic helped to provide short-term relief for his pain but did not help to improve his overall health. One day, a visiting community worker screened Abdihakim for malnutrition and identified

that he was moderately malnourished. Abdihakim was admitted to a nutrition program right away and underwent bi-weekly treatment. After a month and a half, Abdihakim made a full recovery and was able to return home to his family. This therapeutic nutrition project is supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development in collaboration with Canadian Foodgrains Bank.
