SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Responsive Psalm 43

Vindicate me, O God, and defend my cause
against an ungodly people;

**from those who are deceitful and unjust
deliver me!**

Galatians 6:2-10

Take care that you yourselves are not tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfil the law of Christ. For if those who are nothing think they are something, they deceive themselves. All must test their own work; then that work, rather than their neighbour's work, will become a cause for pride. For all must carry their own loads.

Those who are taught the word must share in all good things with their teacher. Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit.

So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith.

2 Timothy 2:1-7

You then, my child, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus; and what you have heard from me through many witnesses, entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well. Share in suffering like a good soldier of Christ Jesus... the soldier's aim is to please the enlisting officer. And in the case of an athlete, no one is crowned without competing according to the rules. It is the farmer who does the work who ought to have the first share of the crops. Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in all things.

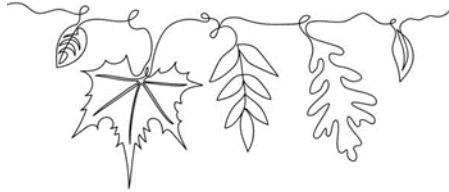

Mission Moment – Presbyterian College Montréal



The Presbyterian College (PC) is one of three theological colleges in the Presbyterian Church in Canada. We support all three through the denomination's Presbyterian Sharing budget, and PC specifically through our "St. Andrew's Mission Fund." The smallest of the three seminaries, the Presbyterian College is in the vibrant city of Montreal and affiliated with McGill University. It is a diverse community of study, prayer, and worship. Students from the world over gather to study theology, with their various backgrounds and ways of being and worshipping together. They support and challenge each other. In partnership with the School of Religious Studies, McGill, students study for the Bachelor of Theology; Master of Divinity; and Master of Sacred Theology degrees. They rub shoulders with people of other faith traditions. They learn to truly listen to others and to articulate their own faith as they worship, study, and play together. The courses which Presbyterians take at PC prepare students for ministry within the Presbyterian Church in Canada and across the world. Students grow intellectually through their studies, but also spiritually through the small college community who worship, pray, and share meals together. Above and beyond the support we provide to the Presbyterian College through our individual donations to the Mission Fund of St. Andrew's, our congregation also generously supports one of our own elders, Julielee Stitt, as she explores her call to the ministry at the Presbyterian College.
