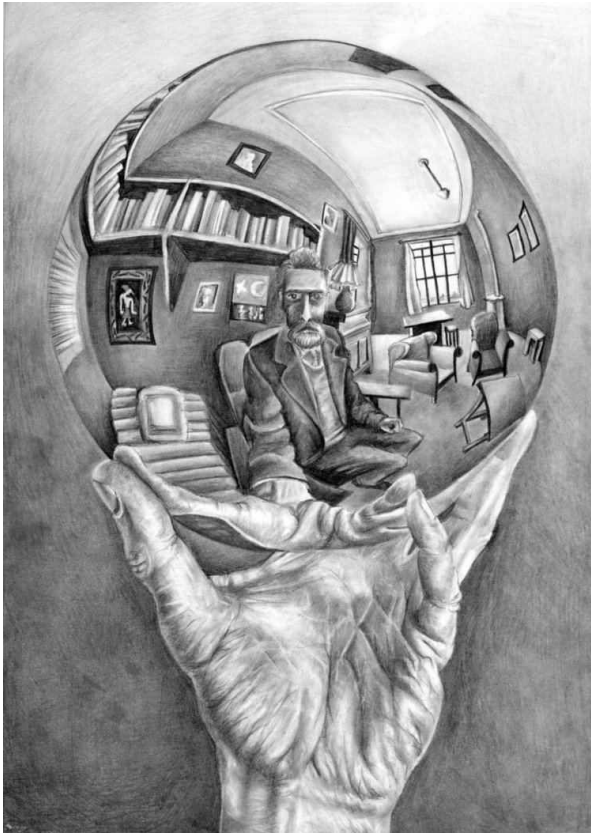

SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Genesis 3:21-24

And the Lord God made garments of skins for the man and for his wife, and clothed them.

Then the Lord God said, 'See, the man has become like one of us, knowing good and evil; and now, he might reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever'— therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from which he was taken. He drove out the man; and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim, and a sword flaming and turning to guard the way to the tree of life.

2 Samuel 7:18-27

Then King David went in and sat before the Lord, and said, 'Who am I, O Lord God, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? And yet this was a small thing in your eyes, O Lord God; you have spoken also of your servant's house for a great while to come. May this be instruction for the people, O Lord God! And what more can David say to you? For you know your servant, O Lord God! Because of your promise, and according to your own heart, you have wrought all this greatness, so that your servant may know it. Therefore you are great, O Lord God; for there is no one like you, and there is no God besides you, according to all that we have heard with our ears. Who is like your people, like Israel? Is there another nation on earth whose God went to redeem it as a people, and to make a name for himself, doing great and

awesome things for them, by driving out before his people nations and their gods? And you established your people Israel for yourself to be your people for ever; and you, O Lord, became their God. And now, O Lord God, as for the word that you have spoken concerning your servant and concerning his house, confirm it for ever; do as you have promised. Thus your name will be magnified for ever in the saying, “The Lord of hosts is God over Israel”; and the house of your servant David will be established before you. For you, O Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, have made this revelation to your servant, saying, “I will build you a house”; therefore, your servant has found courage to pray this prayer to you.

Colossians 3:12-14

As God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

Revelation 19:6-8

Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty thunder-peals, crying out,

‘Hallelujah!

For the Lord our God

the Almighty reigns.

Let us rejoice and exult

NOTES FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

Today's selection of music follows the same format as last week, with three Preludes by German composers based on a Trinity Hymn. *Vater Unser Im Himmelreich* was composed by V. Schumann for the *Geistliche Lieder* of 1539. It will be played first before the three **Preludes**.

The **Anthem** by British composer F.A. Gore Ouseley is based on Malachi 1:11. It has been a very popular anthem with choirs for over a hundred years: not too difficult but with great impact.

"For from the rising of the sun even unto the going down of the same my name shall be great among the Gentiles; and in every place incense shall be offered unto my name, and a pure offering: for my name shall be great among the heathen, saith the LORD of hosts." (Malachi 1:11)

The service closes with a **Postlude** by another great French early Baroque composer, Louis-Nicolas Clérambault (1676-1749). It is another "Dialogue" where we hear different voices of the pipe organ "talking" to one another. These pieces are fun to play. They are sometimes serious, but with a good injection of frivolity.

Mission Moment – Food Aid in Pakistan



Prema and her five children live in the Umerkot district of Pakistan. After her husband's death, Prema found it very difficult to provide for her family. Severe drought throughout the district only brought more hardship. Her eldest son tried his best to find work so that he could help support his mother and siblings, but his job prospects were limited due to a physical disability. A glimmer of hope came when Prema and her family were selected for a food assistance project run by Presbyterian World Service &

Development's local partner. The food aid that Prema's family has received through the project has helped them to become more resilient to future adverse events.
