SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Responsive Psalm 46

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth be moved,

and though the mountains be toppled into the depths of the sea;

though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble at its tumult.

There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.

God is in the midst of this city; it shall not be overthrown;

God shall help it at the break of day. The nations make much ado, and the dominions are shaken; God has spoken, and the earth shall melt away.

The hand of the Lord came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all round them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. He said to me, 'Mortal, can these bones live?' I answered, 'O Lord God, you know.' Then he said to me,

'Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord. Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the Lord.'

So I prophesied as I had been commanded; and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them; but there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, 'Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live.' I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

Then he said to me, 'Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, "Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely." Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people; and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves, and bring you up from your graves, O my people. I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act, says the Lord.'

John 20: 19-22

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' NOTES FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

One of the best known Plainsong melodies is *Veni Creator Spiritus*. With an original Latin text, its origins go back to the 9th century. The first **Prelude** by Zachau, who was Handel's teacher, is based on this early plainsong melody. Through the centuries this hymn about the coming of the Holy Spirit has undergone several transformations. A translation of the Latin text by Martin Luther in the late 15th century, *Komm, heiliger Geist, Herre_Gott*, was set to a hymn tune composed in 1524 by Johann Klug. This hymn tune is played as the second **Prelude**, followed by a little fugue arrangement by German composer Andreas Armsdorf (1670-1699). In 1627 the Latin was translated into English by Bishop John Cosin and later used by Thomas Attwood (1765-1838) for a sensitive setting with solo and chorus. It is heard as our **Anthem**.

The service ends with some more music by Handel. This week we celebrated the birthday of the great Queen Victoria. When I was a lad, we called this day "Firecracker Day" because every neighbourhood set off fireworks. Far less celebration is done today and many don't even know what the holiday is all about. In 1749, Handel was commissioned to compose music for a celebratory fireworks display which turned out to be a bit of a fizzling fiasco; but the music lives on. The **Postlude** is the closing piece from the enduring suite we know today as "Music for the Royal Fireworks".


