

NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

Compared to our neighbours to the south, Canada is not much of a flag waving nation. We tend to be proud of our nation in a quieter way. However, Canada Day weekend is a bit of an exception and today we wave our Canadian flags proudly. Two of the **Preludes** are by British-Canadian composer Healey Willan (1880-1968) who is recognized as one of Canada's greatest composers. Happily, much of his music is church-related. *Un Canadien Errant* is a sad folk song from 1842, popular in French Canada, and has to do with the expulsion of rebels to the United States.

One of the first songs that might have been called a "national Anthem" was composed by Torontonian Alexander Muir in 1867. He was inspired by an actual maple leaf that had fallen from a tree. That tree fell down in a wind in 2013 and several items of interest have been made from its wood. The Maple Leaf Forever has a great tune and has often been used in Hollywood movies when any Canada-related scenes are featured. The opening lyrics are unfortunate, and although not anti-French, are certainly pro-British. Muir later changed one line of the text to mention the fleur-de-lis along with the thistle, shamrock and rose. Were it not for those opening lines, The Maple Leaf Forever might well have become our official national anthem. It remains a great piece of music and is used as the Regimental Slow March of the Fort Henry Guard. In 1997, the CBC set up a contest inviting new lyrics from the general public. The winner was Vladimir Radian, a recent Romanian immigrant. I have had printed out some of his lyrics along with Muir's so that you might have them in your mind as you hear an arrangement I have composed for organ and bagpipes. Thanks to our piper Eric McCracken for the idea!

The **Anthem** is a song dedicated to "The Rt. Hon. Sir John A. Macdonald, G.C.B., First Premier of the Dominion of Canada". It was composed in 1890 by Mrs. M.J. Whitt of Clinton, Ontario, a long-time piano and organ teacher, using words written by her brother-in-law Samuel Whitt of Toronto. There were many patriotic songs like this written in this time period and especially during the first World War. If we tend to take things for granted and forget what a great country we live in, talk to some recent immigrants who will happily wave our Canadian flag vigorously.

That noblest emblem of the free.





Mission Moment – Food Assistance in Pakistan



"The earthquake experience is unlike any other," shared D, a 68-year-old retiree. When a powerful earthquake struck the border region between northern Syria and southeast Türkiye, the damage and loss were overwhelming. The earthquake caused widespread displacement, with many people fleeing their homes for fear of aftershocks and further collapses. At the time, the Syrian population was already profoundly impacted by the persisting war and the country's economic collapse. PWS&D

responded through our partners to provide temporary shelter, muchneeded mattresses, blankets, hygiene kits, hot meals and psychological support to affected families. In addition, with Canadian Foodgrains Bank, our partners are providing monthly food rations to those most affected.
