who is seeking to discern what to do or whom to choose.

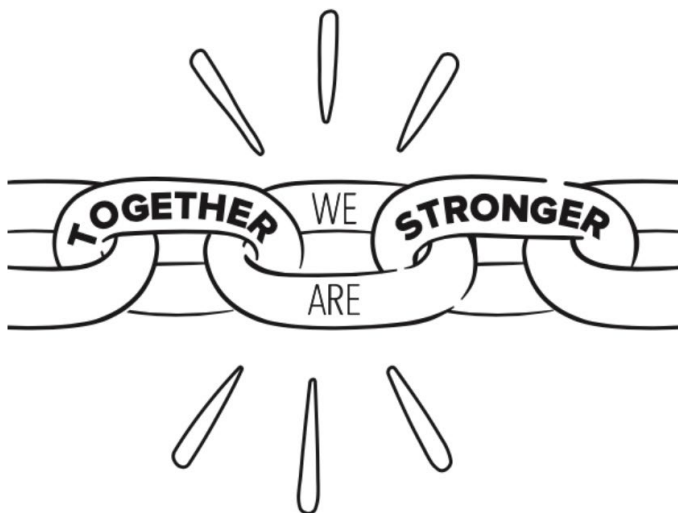
Give us a love in such an abundance that it can't be contained

Mission Moment – Aid in Somolia



Nadhifa, a single mother of seven in Somalia, had to relocate with her two oldest daughters and one-year-old son, Hamza, to a camp for internally displaced people after drought caused her to lose her livelihood. She left her other four children behind with relatives, fearing for their survival. Nadhifa and her three children journeyed to the Dollow district to seek humanitarian assistance. During screening at the camp, Hamza was diagnosed with severe acute malnutrition. With the support of PWS&D, Hamza received treatment and recovered after a few weeks. In addition, Nadhifa participated in the

infant and young child feeding community information session, where she gained valuable nutrition knowledge. “I feel relieved that my son’s health has improved, and I can now search for work to provide food for my children,” she shared.
