

SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Responsive Psalm 78:1-4; 12-16

Hear my teaching, O my people; incline your ears to the words of my mouth.

I will open my mouth in a parable; I will declare the mysteries of ancient times.

That which we have heard and known, and what our ancestors have told us, we will not hide from their children.

We will recount to generations to come the praiseworthy deeds and the power of the Lord, who has done wonderful works...

God worked marvels in the sight of their ancestors, in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan, splitting open the sea and letting them pass through, making the waters stand up like walls;

leading them with a cloud by day,

NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

The organ music today is by four great French composers. The three **Preludes** all share the same title and are examples of the smaller, little known works by prominent organists of the day. Alexandre Guilmant was born in Bologne in 1837. His father was an organist there and taught him to play the organ at an early age. He was able to take a prominent post at the age of sixteen. He was an important teacher, founded a new school of music in Paris and taught at the Paris Conservatoire. He toured the world and became one the finest organists of his day. He died in 1911.

César Franck was born in Belgium in 1822, became a naturalized French citizen and made his career in France until his death in Paris in

1890. He developed a unique style of writing for a variety of instruments and ensembles and most of his output was for the church.

Charles Gounod (1818-1895) was a theological student for two years, intent on the priesthood, but turned towards composition, mainly for the theatre – his opera *Faust* being his best known work. He was a church organist and much of his output was also for the church.

The magnificent old French pipe organs were an inspiration to many composers including Louis Nicolas Clérambault (1676-1749). The **Postlude** is a typical "Dialogue" with a variety of moods and a conversation between two contrasting sets of pipes. Fortunately, they do not get into an argument.
