NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

This Sunday we look at the chorale "Wachet auf" which we know in English as "Sleeper's Wake". This chorale has a long history. The original chorale was written around 1598 by German composer Philipp Nicolai (1556-1608) who based it on a melody by Hans Sachs (1494-1576). The original tune is played as the **third Prelude**. A more recent translation of the text by Carl P. Daw, with a harmonization by J.S. Bach appears in our Book of Praise, #127. The hymn inspired many composers. Felix Mendelssohn arranged it for his oratorio St. Paul and we hear it today for our **Anthem**. German organist and composer Johann Gottfried Walther (1684-1748) made a chorale prelude

arrangement of "Wachet auf" which is presented as the **Postlude**. The **second Prelude** is another of his compositions, based on a Christmas Chorale "Lobt Gott, Ihr Christen, Allzugleich" (Let all Christians praise our God).

Throughout the Christmas season, I will be presenting several organ pieces based on French carols (Noels). The **first Prelude** today is by Claude Balbastre (1729-1799) and is based on "Comment tu oze petite Rose". Balbastre was one of the most famous musicians of his time in France, organist of Notre Dame in Paris and of The Chapelle Royale. During the French revolution he saved his life by playing triumphant revolutionary songs and hymns on the organ – a good thing for all organists to know.
