Third Sunday in Advent OV

Voice 1: The prophets call and an apostle writes to announce that joy comes from God.

Voice 2: "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me...and has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, ...to comfort all who mourn; ...to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning..."

NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706) was a friend of the father of the great J.S. Bach and the composer of many fine works including last week's Postlude and this week's **Prelude**. Again, his chorale prelude is in a fugetta style and I will precede it with the original chorale harmonized by J.S. Bach. The original words were by Martin Luther in 1523 and shortly after, a translation was made by Bishop Coverdale in 1539. It appeared in his book with the curious title *Goostly Psalmes and Spiritualle Songes:*

(I love the old language and spelink)

Be glad now, all ye christen men,
And let us rejoice unfaynedly,
The kyndnesse cannot be written with penne
That we have receaved of God's mercy,
Whose love towards us hath never ende:
He hath done for us as a frende;
Now let us thank him hartely.

The tune for today's **Anthem** comes from a region of in the northeast of France called Besançon and first appeared in a collection entitled Recueil de Noëls anciens au patois de Besançon published in 1842. The words are by Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965) a celebrated author of plays, poems and children's books and is best known for her hymn "Morning has Broken".

We are so close to Christmas so I must conclude the service with another Noël, this time by one of the most famous composers of Noëls for organ, Louis Claude D'Aquin (1694-1772). This is the tenth of his collection and his often playful extemporization is based on the French carol "Bon Joseph, écoutez-moi".
