# Responsive Psalm 89:1-4, 19-26

I will set his hand on the sea and his right hand on the rivers.


He shall cry to me, "You are my Father, my God, and the Rock of my salvation!"

# Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

# NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

Pietro Yon (1886-1943) was born and educated in Italy. He was invited to be organist at St. Francis Xavier Church in New York City in 1907. He became a popular recitalist, teacher and composer. It was in 1917 that he composed the well-known Gesù Bambino with his own Italian words. A different text was later devised by Frederick Martens. We are delighted that Marianne Emig Carr has taken time from her busy schedule to sing this for us today.

The text of Lo, How a Rose has unknown origins but the first German words appeared in print in 1599. Es ist ein Ros entsprungem (literally, "A rose has sprung up" refers to a text from Isaiah 11:1

"And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots."

The rose in the German text is a reference to Mary and this carol is sometimes referred to as "the Marian Hymn". Mary is the rose that has sprung from the stem of Jesse. In 1609, the German composer Michael Praetorius composed the music which we enjoy to this day. Johannes Brahms (1833-1897), toward the end of his life, composed a few organ pieces and this chorale prelude, based on the Praetorius tune, is his most popular. We hear the original chorale followed by Brahms's chorale prelude with the tune well hidden.
